

# Cash / Trade Policy

We accept most used books (all types – all genres), VHS, DVD's, Audio Books, Music CD's, and Video Games (all types – all platforms). When bringing in used books or media items, you have TWO options to choose from – CASH or TRADE.

Cash offers are made on a case-by-case basis, and can vary greatly, depending on what you bring us, and the condition of the items you bring us. For current college textbooks, we often pay more in cash than the college bookstores...

## How to Trade In Your Books for Store Credit

Trading your books is simple: just drop them off at the counter when you come in the store. You can go browse while we figure your trade credit. When you're done shopping, return to the counter and we'll ring up your purchases, apply your trade credit and tell you how much credit you have left, if any. We keep track of your trade credit on our computer, so you don't have to clutter your wallet with credit slips.

## How Much Store Credit You Can Get for Your Trades

So, how much store credit can you get for your used books?

All books & media items generally earn you store credit equal to 25% to 50% of the amount for which we think we can sell them. The exact amount is assessed on a case-by-case basis.

Store Credit can be used for up to 50% of a purchase. For instance, if you wish to purchase \$10 of used books, and have \$7 of credit, you may only use \$5 of your credit towards the purchase. In this example, the total cash outlay for this purchase would be \$5.35:

\$10.00	books purchased
-5.00	store credit (50% of purchase)
+ .45	9% sales tax (City & State)
-----	
\$5.45	total cash outlay

\$2.00 trade credit left on file that you can use on future purchases

You always have to spend a little cash, otherwise we wouldn't be able to stay in business. The utility companies and our landlord don't accept books as payment, so we have to have some money coming in to keep our doors open. :-) We, of course, accept debit cards, Visa, Mastercard, and Discover, as well as cash or check.

As many of you are aware, we have over 25 non-profit organizations, such as local area libraries, churches, sports organizations, and private schools that we help raise money. We do this by selling used books and media items they have collected on a 50/50 consignment basis – the organizations receive 50% of the revenue generated from these items.
